FINANCIAL SECURITY

Q1 2025 Request for Proposals



OVERVIEW

United Way North Central Florida (UWNCFL) invites eligible nonprofit organizations to apply for funding under our Financial Security Impact Area. This initiative supports ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) households by providing resources to achieve financial stability and independence. Organizations receiving funding will be recognized as Impact Partners, collaborating with UWNCFL to create thriving communities.



FUNDING DETAILS

Total available funding is \$40,000.00 with the intent to award funds to one (1) agency program although funds may be split between two (2) agency programs. Applicants must apply under one (1) of the following funding options:

- 1. One-Time Assistance Funds
- 2. Financial Literacy Support



FUNDING OPTIONS

One-Time Assistance Funds: Provide direct assistance to ALICE households to address urgent needs such as:

- Rent/mortgage payments to prevent eviction or foreclosure.
- Utility payments (including Internet) to avoid disconnection.
- Critical vehicle repairs to maintain employment.
- Prescription assistance for essential medication(s).
- Childcare to maintain employment.



FUNDING OPTIONS

Financial Literacy Support: Deliver long-term financial literacy programs (must be a minimum of 4-weeks and include regular follow-up for a minimum 3-months post program) to help ALICE households build sustainable financial skills, including:

- Budgeting and savings
- Financial counseling and coaching
- Access to financial tools and resources
- Credit-building and debt management education



ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Serve residents in one or more of the following counties: Alachua, Bradford, Dixie, Gilchrist, Levy, or Union.
- Be a 501(c)(3) nonprofit in good standing or an eligible public entity (e.g., schools, libraries).
- Been in operation for a minimum of two (2) years.
- Provide health, welfare, or social services that align with UWNCFL's Impact Area.
- Have a policymaking, volunteer Board of Directors meeting at least quarterly.
- Adhere to non-discrimination policies.
- Be fiscally stable.
- Agree to comply with UWNCFL's Impact Partner Policies and Procedures.
